#### THE "SATELLITE GIRLS" FROM AKRON, OHIO

The "Satellite Girls", Elizabeth Price, Ashley Falls, Katelyn Jefferys, and Julia Moyer, from Roswell Kent Middle School were selected as one of five winning US teams to present their research at the GLOBE Learning Expedition in Cape Town, South Africa in June 2008. Their science project, "This is Why I'm Hot", showed comparisons of temperature measurements using an Infrared Thermometer in cities throughout Ohio. Their science teacher was Steve Frantz.

#### THE DISTINGUISHED AWARD OF COUNCIL

The Distinguished Award of Council is presented annually to an outstanding citizen for his/her technical and managerial achievements and involvement in civic activities. The 2008 recipient of this award is Dr Nick Triantafillopoulos, Director, Technology, OMNOVA Solutions Inc.

Dr Triantafillopoulos is responsible for front-end innovation and management of technology resources. He works closely with sales and marketing teams, as well as customers, to define new product platforms and step-out products, while driving new product commercialization.



Dr Triantafillopoulos earned his BSE (1981) and MS (1985) in Paper Engineering from Western Michigan U (WMU) and his PhD from the Institute of Paper Science & Technology, Atlanta, GA (1992), in fluid dynamics and non-Newtonian fluid rheology. He is an expert in thin-film mechanics, coating processes, and dispersion rheology. He has authored/co-authored four books/book chapters and over 65 papers, and has given numerous invited presentations and tutorials worldwide on coating processes, coating defects and rheology. He is a technical editor of the Technical Association of the Pulp & Paper Industry (TAPPI) Journal and serves in the editorial staff of Applied Rheology.

Dr Triantafillopoulos has been a lecturer and PhD advisor at several universities in the US and Scandinavia, and has adjunct faculty appointments in ChE at WMU and U of Maine. He became a TAPPI Fellow in 2006 and has been recognized with OMNOVA's Eagle of Excellence, American Forest Products Association's Olmsted and TAPPI Coating & Graphic Arts Technical Award.

He serves in the board of OMNOVA Foundation - which distributes \$1.1 million annually in Education grants, the TAPPI Coating & Graphic Arts Council and the Advisory Board of ACESS.
